Interfaith groups to build house together for Alachua Habitat's Interfaith Day of Fellowship

Gainesville, FL – Members of local Christian, Jewish, and Muslim faith congregations will get together for food, faith, fun, and foundation-building **on Sunday, February 11 from noon to 5:00 pm at 3514 SE 21st Ave.**

The afternoon will start with a short Interfaith devotional service with select Muslim, Christian, and Jewish prayers representing each of the three Abrahamic faiths. Participants will have a quick lunch provided by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, and then will build together on the Habitat houses under construction at the Hammock Oaks build site in southeast Gainesville.

Participating congregations include: The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, Temple Shir Shalom, The Hoda Center, Trinity United Methodist Church, Westminster Presbyterian Church, and the Catholic Gators from UF.
